Five Named To Posts At College

President Charles B. Kinney has announced new appointments in the History, Science, and Modern Language Departments at Mattatuck Community College.

Appointments announced include Dr. Eva R. Herzfeld, assistant professor of history, Richard T. Nolan, instructor of history and philosophy, Joseph V. Anthony, assistant professor of biological sciences, Anthony P. Vitarelli, instructor of biological sciences and Frank A. Zappala, instructor of modern languages.

Dr. Herzfeld earned her Bachelor of Arts degree at Hunter College, her Master of Arts degree at Teachers College, Columbia University and her Doctor of Education degree at Columbia University. During the past year Dr. Herzfeld was on the part time faculty as Lecturer at Teachers College, Columbia University and as Lecturer at the City University, New York. She also served as Instructor at Adelphi University on the part-time faculty. Other teaching experience included assignments in high schools in Equador and Far Rockaway, New York. Dr. Herzfeld is married and has two children.

Nolan, earned his Bachelor of Arts degree at Trinity College, his Bachelor of Divinity degree at Hartford Seminary Foundation, his Master of Arts at Yale University and is currently a doctoral candidate at New York University.
