

## Rev. Nolan, Waltham Native, Named Assistant at Seminary

The Rev. Richard T. Nolan, 31, formerly of Waltham, has been appointed assistant dean of the Hartford Seminary Foundation, effective July 1. Having joined the faculty last fall, he has also been named lecturer in philosophy and education and managing editor of "The Hartford Quarterly," the Foundation's scholarly journal.

A graduate of Boston Latin School and Tabor Academy, the Episcopal clergyman received a B.A. in 1960 from Trinity College, Hartford. On route to completing a B.D. degree at Hartford Seminary in 1963, he studied for a year at Berkeley Divinity School, New Haven, completed a three month summer program in clinical pastoral training with the Institute of Pastoral Care at Conn. Valley Hospital, and studied at Union Theological Seminary, N.Y. Between 1963 and 1965 he completed course work toward a Ph.D. degree in religious education at New York University and is currently writing his thesis for the degree. In 1967 he received an M.A. in Religion from Yale.

Assistant Dean-elect Nolan was ordained a deacon in Christ Church, Waltham, in 1963, where he had been baptized in 1937 by then rector the Rev. George O. Ekwall, now archdeacon of the Diocese of Massachusetts and a Waltham resident. He was ordained to the priesthood two years later.

Editor of the recently published "The Diaconate Now," a book in theology, Mr. Nolan has held positions and ad-

joined posts at Watkinson School (Hartford), Choir School of the Cathedral Church of St. John the Divine (N.Y.), Cheshire Academy (Conn.), University of Miami (Fla.), Long Island University, University of Hartford, and the University of Connecticut. This summer he will teach a course in Oriental religions at his alma mater, Trinity College.

Since his ordination in 1963, the former Waltham resident has served as a Sunday assistant and summer minister in parishes of the dioceses of New York and Connecticut. He is in his third year as a Sunday assistant and consultant in Christian Education at Trinity Church, Bristol, Conn., his present home town.

Dean Nolan is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas M. Nolan Jr., former owners of Jean's Restaurant, Moody St., now living in Florida.

His grandmother is Mrs. Charles A. Leishman of the Beaver Brook Apartments, Grove St. He will continue a relationship with Trinity Church along with his new Foundation post.
